- The File System is one of the most important parts of the OS to a user
- There are mainly 6 partitions in Android phones, tablets and other Android devices.



Android uses the Linux file system structure which has a single root and does not have a drive letter as in Windows.



ro: mounted as read only rw: mounted as read and write

For basic document viewing and manipulation, Google's free Google Docs app is often enough to get the job done. The Google Docs app lets you create, view, and edit word processing and spreadsheet documents stored within your cloud-based Google Docs account. The interface is incredibly limited, however, so if you need to do anything more than reading or unformatted text input, you'll want a more robust solution.

- Task Manager
- Cloud storage client

Android Marshmallow File Management

Marshmallow now includes a secret native file manager. Why do we say secret? Google hasn't touted the feature at all and it's not switched on by default. To top it off, it's a little bit hidden away in the Android settings.

How to find and turn on the file manager in Android Marshmallow



- Launch the Settings app.
- Tap on Storage & USB.
- Scroll to the bottom and select Explore.

You'll now see a screen with all the files and folders on your device.

- Browse the file system
- Open files
- Select one or more files
- Share one or more files to an app

Delete one or more files Copy files to another folder



- Search for files
- Choose between list and grid view
- Choose how to sort the files
